NEW: Community Engagement Staff Exchange



The Community Engagement Staff Exchange, or the Exchange, is an online platform designed by RWC for national and local resettlement agency staff whose roles include community sponsorship and community engagement. Through resource sharing and purposeful communication, the Exchange will serve as a dynamic space for engagement, learning, and collaboration.

The Exchange will be rolled out by RWC on December 5, 2024. RWC sends out invitations to join the Exchange to all users identified. Additionally, RWC members, who are part of a collaborative group

of community sponsorship (CS) experts from national and local resettlement agencies (RAs) dedicated to advancing refugee resettlement efforts across the United States, will invite staff whose roles include community sponsorship and community engagement from their networks to join the Exchange.
